For the next four decades Orville was involved in all types of automobile racing, acquiring over 300 trophies and cash awards. His greatest achievement was a 1978 Lincoln Continental low rider, with four-way hydraulics and chopped top. With this car he won the most popular car in show at International Show Car Association competition. The car also won for best engineered and drew great respect from his customers. The car still makes appearances at local parades and festivals. With the growth in Lone Oak there was no more room for expansion and the business was moved to Broadway in early 1990. JOHN ANTHONY HENNEBERGER

SEP 4, 1923-JUL 18, 2017

EVANSVILLE, IN—John Anthony Henneberger, of Evansville, Indiana, died on July 18 at his home in Oak Meadow at age 93. He was born in Mount Carmel, Illinois, the youngest of Lawrence Francis Henneberger and Elmima van Dyke Utter Henneberger's four children. As a child, he often sat on the curb in front of their home on East 4th, just off Main Street, and "spoke to everyone who passed by." And the speaking-to-every-living-soul part became a life-long habit. John was educated at St. Mary's Elementary School, Mt. Carmel High School, Culver Military Academy, the University of Notre Dame and Indiana University, where he transferred after the attack on Pearl Harbor, because he hoped to join the Army Air Corps, and ND at that time had Navy but not Army ROTC. John had followed his two older brothers, Francis and Bob, to Notre Dame, where he was a government and history major, played on the varsity tennis team and was the only freshman soloist for the Notre Dame Glee Club. He also sang lead second tenor in the ND quartet and performed on the Bill Stern Sports Show at the premier of the movie 'Knut Rockne All American,' where he met Carole Lombard, Clark Gable, Pat O'Brien, and his future favorite president, Ronald Reagan. At Indiana University, he joined Alpha Tau Omega fraternity and served as the group's song leader - a role that meant he led the serenade of any woman getting pinned to a fraternity brother. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps in November of 1942, flew the P-51 Mustang - a long-range, single-seat fighter bomber -- and never forgot the men with whom he served, many of whom died in Normandy. That was the first of many times he cheated death, the second being his head-on collision with an 18-wheeler swerving to avoid a tractor stopped in the middle of the road. That accident left him paralyzed for six months in his mid-twenties. After the war, he went into business with his brother Bob, an Army JAG who'd been attached to a general hospital unit in Morocco and was in charge of booking USO shows for GIs still serving in Paris in the months after the liberation. Together, they opened the popular Sports Center on Mount Carmel's Main Street, and along with their top saleswoman -- their aunt, Reba Reese, who lived with the family -- they sold not only sports and scouting equipment, bikes, trains, toys, dolls, guns and boats, but many of the major appliances that had been in short supply during WWII. After they sold the store in the 50s, John went to work with his father at Henneberger Service, Ice & Fuel Company, the oldest coal and home fuel oil distributor in the state. Originally, the business had delivered ice for home ice boxes on horse-drawn carts, and John's first job was cleaning out the stalls for 10 cents an hour. Much (much) later, when he was running the business and the phone would ring in the middle of a winter night, John's family knew that it was someone who was cold, in need of fuel, unlikely to be able to pay for it -- and that he would get up and deliver it himself, to avoid having to disturb an employee. When his father L.F. retired from the Mount Carmel bank he'd co-founded and run for many years, Security Bank & Trust Co., John joined its board of directors. He served in that capacity for the next 27 years, and went on to become president, CEO and chairman of the board. John revered both of his parents, and was probably proudest of the fact that during the 1930 run on the bank that temporarily closed Security, his father had been the last person to withdraw what was left of his money. John also inherited his love for the Chicago Cubs from his dad, who was married in October of 1908 and on his honeymoon took his bride to Chicago to see that year's World Series champions play. Before cable, John often spent summer weekend afternoons listening to Cub games in his car, or holding his transistor radio to his ear

while he mowed, though how he could hear over the noise no one knew. He also took his family on several pilgrimages to St. Louis to watch the Cubs play the Cardinals and stay at the Chase Park Plaza, because the Cub players also stayed there and were beyond gracious about signing autographs and indulging pesky kids. One of the most treasured family photos among the thousands John spent time cataloguing in recent years was the snapshot of Ron Santo and Randy Hundley taken the day they gave a swimming lesson to his son John L. at the hotel pool. John Anthony, who was named for his uncle, Father Tony, was also a lifelong Notre Dame fan, of course, and in his last few days remarked that before he died he wanted to see their new football stadium -- "Let's go for a week, and stay at the Morris Inn" -- and throw a couple of big dinner parties, one for his extended family, and another for all of those who had been so good to him while he was sick. A proud and occasionally loud conservative, he often stayed up late discussing politics with his siblings, chaired many local GOP committees and was active in and passionate about the right-to-life movement. John was also a past president of the Culver Military Academy Father's Board, where he received the outstanding service award, a member of the Culver Education Foundation, co-founder of the Mt. Carmel Little League, a charter member of the Wabash Valley Association, president of the Wabash Valley College Foundation, and for many years a trustee of St. Mary's Catholic Church, where he was baptized, catechized and confirmed, and was a Eucharistic minister and member of the Knights of Columbus. He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Freida Lawrence Henneberger, a Kentucky native he met when she moved to Mount Carmel to teach high school in 1956. He proposed three weeks later, and they were married six months after that, in the parsonage of Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Hopkinsville, Kentucky. He's also survived by his two daughters, Melinda Henneberger (Bill Turque) of Kansas City, Joane Henneberger Pickett, (Wiley Pickett) of Los Angeles, three grandchildren, Della Lane and John Connor Turque-Henneberger and Wiley John Pickett, and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his only son, John Lawrence Henneberger, who was killed at age 16 in a motorcycle accident, as well as by his parents and his siblings, Francis James Henneberger, Robert Lawrence Henneberger and Virginia Henneberger King. Lover of American and Roman history, picnics, the National Review and later Fox News, John Wayne, martinis, cream-filled long johns and rhubarb pie, he went out of his way for friends and strangers, visited his sister Ginny every day she was in the nursing home, and was always telling people what they were good at - "You're a great American," he'd say. His favorite moments included his honeymoon in Jamaica, meeting Pope John Paul II in Rome with Melinda, watching the judging of Rose Bowl floats with Joane and Wiley and bird hunting with John L. Even during his final illness, he kept his sense of humor, excellent memory and love of words to live by, like, "Don't quit in the chasm," "When you want to go fast, go slow," and his #1 go-to, "Fight on to victory." A vigil will be held on Thursday from 4-8 p.m. at Browning Funeral Home, 738 E. Diamond Avenue in Evansville, with a rosary service at 7 p.m. His funeral Mass will be held at 10 a.m. Friday at St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church in Daylight, Indiana, near where John and Freida moved after their retirement 17 years ago. She received the 2014 NSDAR Mary Smith Lockwood Medal for Education Presentation and Recognition, a national founders medal in recognition for lifetime achievements in cultural, education, humanitarian, and Christian service locally and worldwide. She was also a member of the National Active and Retired Federal Employees Association (NARFE), and the Woman's Missionary Union at Cadiz Baptist Church. She was a member of Rock Front Baptist Church. She was born Jan. 5, 1924, in Trigg County. Mary Feltner graduated from Big Rock High School in 1940 at age 16 as valedictorian. She continued to excel academically, earning a BS in Home Economics from Austin Peay State University in 1944; a Master's in Nutrition in 1949 and a Ph.D. in Biochemistry/Nutrition in 1952, both from the University of Wisconsin. In 1947, she married Maurice C. Futrell from Trigg County, who also earned a Ph.D. and worked as a plant pathologist and agronomist for the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The doctors Futrell went on countless mission trips. Vacations were spent on mission trips on Ailigande Island off the coast of Panama teaching Cuna Indians how to grow their own food and prepare it, or working alongside fulltime missionaries in Ecuador. He worked in agriculture, and she in nutrition. Maurice Futrell was a founding member of Agricultural Missions in Tupelo, Ms., which later became Global Outreach International. She worked alongside him as he served on the board of Global Outreach. After his sudden death in 1975, she continued her mission trips and served as a member of the Board of Directors for Global Outreach for 35 years. Her work and mission trips took her to more than 35 countries around the world. In 1976, she founded a school, the Dr. Maurice Futrell Social Service Centre, and later a children's home named after her late grandson, the Michael Dean Futrell home in Bangalore, India. Initially, boys lived in the home, and when she was able to support another building, girls began living there as well. An estimated 2,000 children have benefitted from the ministry over the past 41 years, which is now supported by a number of individuals and groups through Global Outreach International in Tupelo, Ms. Her career included working at the University of Wisconsin in biochemistry; as an assistant professor in the Department of Nutrition in the Experiment Station at Texas A&M University; and teaching clothing and nutrition at Ahmadubello University in Samaru, Nigeria from 1964 to 1966 while her husband took a USDA assignment there. From 1967 to 1987 she served on the Home Economics faculty at Mississippi State University, engaged in both

research and teaching. She initiated the graduate program in Nutrition at MSU. She presented nationally and did research globally. She served as Mississippi State's representative to Women in Development. In 1974 she was named Woman of the Year at MSU, and in 1974, she was honored with the Sigma Xi Scientific Award for the university. In 1981 she was honored with the Gamma Sigma Delta award for research in agriculture, an award her husband had also received in 1971. In 1982 she was named to the Honor Society of the MSU chapter of Phi Kappa Phi. In 1983 she received the MSU Alumni Association Faculty Achievement Award in recognition of outstanding achievements and continuing contributions in research. She was awarded the status of emeritus professor at MSU upon her retirement in 1987. She continued her public speaking in churches and civic clubs until age 90. In Starkville, Ms., she served as an executive board member of the Community Day Care Centers, co-led an international Sunday School class with her husband at First Baptist Starkville. Dr. Mary Futrell leaves two sons and their wives, Edison L. Futrell, and Patricia S. (Patti) Futrell of Marietta, Ga., John Maurice Futrell and I.
